Founded in 1928, Austin Sunshine Camps provides FREE overnight camp adventures for youth who receive free/reduced lunch and youth in foster care. We believe in the power of summer camp, and we believe that your ability to go to camp shouldn't be determined by how much money your family makes. Beginning in 2022, camp is held for 10 days and 9 nights. Summer staff have training and cleaning on day 11, and days 12-14 are off! ASC has two beautiful, unique camp locations:

Located in beautiful Turkey Bend Recreation Area, Lake Travis offers a rustic setting for up to 50 campers, aged 12-15, each session. Campers have the opportunity to swim in the lake, explore the hill country, mountain bike, participate in archery, play a variety of sports, experience our challenge course and more.

Zilker Lodge provides an amazing urban oasis for up to 75 participants, aged 8-11, each session. Campers have the opportunity to swim in Barton Springs, canoe on Lady Bird Lake, hike on the Barton Creek Greenbelt, play a variety of sports, experience our challenge course and more.

## *Camp Nurse/Camp Health Officer*

### About The Role

At Austin Sunshine Camps, we focus on building community and connections, fostering creativity and growth, and building compassion across lines of difference, and we can't do this work without having healthy campers. The Camp Health Officer is the most crucial player in ensuring our kids stay healthy during their time at camp! This role has developed an increasing importance in the era of COVID-19, and will be a crucial part of the team that ensures safety and wellness for all campers and staff.

The Camp Health Officer provides first aid care for campers and staff, oversees the administration of medications to campers and staff, coordinates visits to a physician when needed, monitors health and cleanliness standards, organizes paperwork and maintains file organization. The important work of the Camp Health Officer includes monitoring and evaluating camp procedures, facilities, and conditions and suggesting modifications that would create more healthful conditions at camp.

- You are a registered nurse or licensed vocational nurse (preferred)
- You have an American Red Cross Emergency Response certificate (required if not an RN or LVN)
- You have pediatric and/or previous camp nursing experience (preferred)
- You have the ability to drive a camp vehicle to transport campers to emergency treatment
- You have the ability to pass a national criminal background check
- You have the ability to life or assist campers or staff
- You keep neat and orderly records
- You're able to stay on site while camp is in session (including overnights)

- Our summer stipend is \$3,000-4,000 USD (half summer) or \$6,000-\$8,000 (full summer), commensurate with qualifications and experience
- We provide all meals and snacks while camp is in session
